# **SUMMER HOLIDAYS 2024**



## SPOTLIGHT ON... CHILDREN'S MEAL DEALS IN THE SUMMER HOLIDAYS

**Sizzling Pubs:** Monday to Friday from 12pm – children eat for £1 with an adult main meal.

Asda cafes – All week – children under 16 can eat for £1 – no minimum adult spend. Sainsbury's cafes – All week from 11.30am – children can eat for £1 with an adult's hot main meal (minimum spend £5.20).

Morrisons cafes – Monday to Friday - children under 16 can eat for free with a minimum adult spend of £4.50 on a meal

**Tesco cafes** – From 22<sup>nd</sup> July, children can eat for free with any adult item purchased in the cafe.

**Yo sushi!** – From 1<sup>st</sup> July, Monday to Friday, children under 12 can eat for free all day with a full-paying adult (minimum £10 spend).

**Bella Italia** – Children under 12 can eat for free all day every Thursday and for £1 between 4-6pm Sunday-Wednesday with the purchase of an adult main.

**Hungry Horse** – Up to two children can have a main meal for £1 every Monday from 12pm with every full paying adult.

**Beefeater pubs** – Two children under 16 can have a free breakfast with every adult breakfast purchased.

# **ONLINE SAFETY**

Over the summer holidays, many of our children will have more free time to spend with friends, family and online. This may include using the internet to keep in touch with friends, catch up with the latest apps and online trends, and playing their favourite games.

#### Sit down together

The summer holidays are a great chance to sit down with your children. Together, you can visit their favourite sites and play their favourite games. This is a great way to stay up to date with their online lives and show them that you're interested in what they are doing. This is an opportunity for positive conversations about the internet, so if something ever does upset your child online, they would feel more confident in confiding in you. #### Social media and staying in touch

During the summer holidays, your children may want to keep in touch with their friends through social networking sites or games. It's a good idea to ask them about what sites they use and check any age requirements as many social media sites require users to be at least 13 years old. Encourage your children to use the privacy tools on the services they use so that the content they post is only available to people they know and trust in real life.
