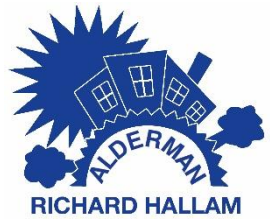

Uniform Policy



Uniform Policy

Principles

It is our policy that all children should wear clothing that is in keeping with a purposeful learning ethos. We also believe it is important that certain activities are facilitated by specialised and appropriate clothing when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. We provide a complete list of the items needed for school uniform in this policy.

Aims

Our policy for school uniform is based on the belief that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- engenders a feeling of community and belonging;
- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school;
- is not distracting in class;
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable and good value for money;
- has been designed with health and safety in mind.

Our colours are royal blue, grey, black and white and the uniform is as follows:

- School royal blue sweatshirt with school logo or other plain, royal blue sweatshirt
- School royal blue cardigan with school logo or other plain, royal blue cardigan
- Plain pale blue or white polo shirt, blouse or cotton shirt
- Grey or black trousers, shorts or skirt (cycling shorts and leggings are not appropriate unless worn underneath a skirt, shorts or trousers)
- Grey pinafore dress
- Blue gingham dresses
- School royal blue book bag with school logo
- Blue, white or black headgear
- *Year 6 pupil may wear their school leaver's hoodies to school*

Footwear

Children must wear sensible black shoes or sandals with a flat heel; heels are not permitted. If it is a wet or cold day, and your child needs to wear wellies or warm boots to travel to school; please make sure they have normal school shoes to change into. Children are encouraged not to wear trainers as the classrooms are carpeted and shoes bring in less dirt, however if the trainers are **completely** black, they *may* be permitted.

P.E. Kits

Indoor P.E. Kit:

- White T-shirt
- Black P.E. shorts
- Black plimsolls
- Gym bag to keep their P.E. kit in

Outdoor P.E. Kit

- White T-shirt

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- Black shorts or jogging bottoms (black leggings or cycling shorts are appropriate for P.E.)
- Black, white or grey hoodie or jumper
- A pair of trainers

Please Note: P.E. kits should be kept in school all week and fully named.

All clothing and footwear should be clearly labelled with your child's name.

Affordability

As a school, we want to ensure that all families are able to provide their child with appropriate school uniform whilst attending Alderman Richard Hallam Primary School. For this reason, jumpers and cardigans with the school logo on are optional and any other royal blue jumper, sweatshirt or cardigan may be worn. As a school, we regularly provide opportunities to buy good-quality second-hand uniforms, such as at our school fayres, and are always grateful for any donations. If you wish to purchase school uniform with the school logo, this is available through the school office.

If ever a family is struggling to afford their child's school uniform, they are encouraged to speak to a member of the school's Senior Leadership Team so that support can be put in place.

Jewellery

On health and safety grounds, we do not allow children to wear jewellery, other than religious jewellery, watches and stud earrings, in our school. For more information, please see the Jewellery Policy.

Make-up and Cosmetics

Make-up and cosmetics (including nail varnish) are not considered appropriate or consistent with our school uniform. The school does not permit such products to be worn by any children, unless there is a specific event for which the Headteacher has given permission.

Sanctions

If a child is not wearing the correct school uniform (Appendix 1) or correct P.E. kit (Appendix 2), an email, Seesaw message or letter will be sent home by the class teacher to inform parents and carers of this and remind them of the expectations. If appropriate, the child will be expected to remove the non-uniform, for example hoodies or hair bows should be taken off and non-black shoes should be changed for their black plimsolls. If necessary, clothing may be used from the medical room for the child to wear.

- Grey or black trousers, shorts or skirt (cycling shorts and leggings are not appropriate unless worn underneath a skirt, shorts or trousers)
- Grey pinafore dress
- Blue gingham dresses
- School royal blue book bag with school logo
- Blue, white or black headgear

This is also the uniform for the children in Year 6.
