Free <u>Little Writer</u>

Allows pupils to practice letter formation, by tracing letters on screen, usually with a small game of getting animals to eat fruit.





Tabtale Books Free/£1.49

There are plenty of titles available; they allow pupils to read the stories on the iPad. Most of these books can read the story to the child, with some allowing the child to record themselves reading to help practice reading and speech.



Restrictions

Restrictions can be turned on to stop access to important parts of the iPad.

Our recommended restrictions would be to turn off the installing and deletion of apps, including in-app purchases (stops worries of expensive bills)

Making sure the content ratings are set to the correct age limit.

Stopping the addition of accounts which, stops e-mail addresses being able to be added as these could be difficult to monitor on a personal device.

iMovie £2.99

This app lets pupils create videos or movies either from scratch or by using a pre-set story board.

Free Meteor Math

Children have to select the correct meteors to add, subtract, divide or multiply to the number shown at the top. As the levels increase the amount of numbers change as does the difficulty of the maths involved.



Numberline Frog 69p

This app uses basic maths; it makes use of a number line with a frog jumping to the answer you select. You get a star for each correct answer

Allows pupil to search for places, see landscapes or certain parts of the world, and learn where countries boarder one another and even see individual places such as our school!

An app in which you explore how light works with the help of a friendly robot. Topics covered include: lasers, lightning, reflection and refraction. The interactivity helps children to learn about light.

Free **Jumbled Sentences**


This app gets children to arrange sentences by dragging the words into the correct order. They are rewarded with coins that can be then used to get stickers.
