Our main focuses are:

- Learning about the occupations that help us.

- To learn about different celebrations.

Literacy

Within Literacy and during free flow we will be focussing on:

- During phonics we will be focussing on segmenting and blending three and four letter words.
- Learning how to write captions, e.g. cat on a mat.
- We will be learning some new sounds, such as II, ss, j, v, w and x.
- Learning new tricky words and how to read and spell them.
- Listening to the initial sounds in simple words.
- Listening to the sounds in a three and four letter word and beginning to write these sounds.
- Learning how to recognise and read capital letters.

<u>Mathematics</u>


Within Mathematics and during free flow we will be:

Shared home learning:

Learning at home is just as important as learning at school. There are a range of ways to support your child's learning including, reading stories together, going on walks and talking about what they can see or singing songs.

During this half term, your child will continue to come home with a reading book and their tricky words. Please read with your child daily for 10 minutes and practise their tricky words.

We will be sending home 'sharing books'. These are books that may be from the library or the classroom collection. These are books your child wont be able to read but for you to share and discuss together

Reading books and library books will be changed once a week. Tricky words will be checked with your child every other week. Please keep a look out on Seesaw for any reading activities that might be on there!
