Our main focuses are:

- Learning how to create a simple map.

- Using simple instructions to control a Beebot.

English

In English we will be exploring our Novel Study book 'Once Upon a Wild Wood' by Chris Riddell which includes many characters from other familiar stories. We will be working on sentence formation, including capital letters and full stops, as well as practising our pre-cursive letters. We will then use these skills to help us to write sentences about our book and describe the characters.

Week 1- Positive emotions week.

Week 2- We will be starting to read our exciting new story 'Once Upon a Wild Wood'. We will recap the alphabet and ensure we know the letter names as well as the sounds they make. We will also think about the main character in the story: Little Green Rain Cape.

Week 3- This week we will become sentence detectives and learn all about what a sentence is and how to write one.

Week 4- We will focus on capital letters and where (and why) we need them this week.

Week 5- Finger spaces and full stops are the focus of this week.

Week 6- During this week we will learn about adjectives and go on an exciting hunt! Do you know any adjectives already?

Week 7- This week we will be using role-play to act out our favourite parts of the story. We will also be using what we have learnt about capital letters, full stops and letter formation to write a simple sentence about the story.

Week 8- This week we will learn all about what a poem is!

Mathematics:

We will be learning about a variety of different disciplines in Mathematics this half term. If you would like to help your child practise these at home, please look at our Calculation Policy on the school website.

Week 1- Counting songs and game's.

Week 2-We will be learning all about numbers to 20 including how to form them correctly and order them.

Week 3-This week will be understanding how to find one more or one less than a number to 20.

Week 4-The focus of this week is to add numbers to 20. What other words do you know for add?

Week 5-This week we will be learning about subtraction within 20.

Week 6- What do you know about 2D shapes? We will be finding out about these this week.

Week 7- 3D shapes is the focus of this week. What 3D shapes can you spot around your home? What shape is a ball? Let's find out!

Week 8- This week we will be learning all about odd and even numbers.









No Outsiders and P.S.H.E

We will be following the 'No Outsiders in Our School' scheme this year. This half term our lessons will be based on the book 'Elmer' and looking at what makes us different

Within PSHE we will think about what makes a good friend and how to talk to each other.

In British Values we are looking at the rule of law.

Computing





- Using commands to control a screen turtle.
- Creating simple instructions.
- Using the words 'debug' and 'algorithm' when describing a simple set of instructions.



Geography

In Geography we will be:

- Using locational and directional language to look at where physical objects are in our surrounding area.
- Looking at our local area and the features within it.
- Locating objects on simple maps.
- Making our own pictorial maps.

Behaviour and Safety

This half term we will be focusing on golden rules, what they are and how we use them in the school setting.

Music

We will be using the Charanga Scheme of work and will be looking at 'Hey You' where we will be learning about rhythm and pulse.

<u>Art</u>

Our focus artist is Adrienne Segur and we be looking at pencil control techniques and tone. At the end of this, the children will be creating their own fairy tale character using pencil.

Communication and language

The role play and the small world area will be used to encourage children to use new vocabulary, their imagination and teamwork skills as well as developing their story telling skills. We will also be focussing on retelling traditional stories using the correct language structures.

<u>R.E.</u>

In Religious Education, we will be learning all about Christianity including what it is and the symbols that are linked to it. We will also find out about Adam and Eve. Finally, we will learn about the Harvest Festival.

Physical Development (P.E.)

Our P.E. lessons this half term will be focussing on developing our fundamental movements of throwing and catching. The children will be developing these skills through different types of games.





Shared home learning:

Please spend 15 minutes, as a minimum, reading with your child every day. This will really help support your child's success in reading. Please record your child's reading in their reading diaries. There will be alternate Phonics or Maths. homework on Seesaw. P.E. days are Tuesday for Pandas and Chimps and Wednesday for Tigers and Leopards. Children should bring their P.E. kits on their allocated P.E. day. These can be left at school during the half-term. We would also like to remind you that children need to have earrings removed before school in order to be able to take part in P.E. sessions.
