Our main focuses are:

- To learn about living things and what they need to keep them alive.
- To learn about Francis Drake and Walter Raleigh and their explorations.
- To learn about Elizabeth I and the impact her rule had on the Tudor era.
- To learn how to create an algorithm to complete a task and understand how to write algorithms down.

Our theme will last for:

Stand up against

The 'Terrible Tudors' is Year 2's non-fiction topic. We will be basing our work on historical non-fiction texts and for fiction we will be looking at the book 'The Actor, The Rebel and The Wrinkled Queen.'

Our main focus in writing this half term is to expand our knowledge of different text types and how to adapt our language and sentence structure to best suit the purpose of the text. We will also be learning a lot of new grammar knowledge, such as using commas in lists, co-ordinating and subordinating conjunctions and, as we are writing about the Tudors, a lot of work on the past tense.

In our reading lessons, we will be focussing on accurate reading and understanding a text to ensure we can answer questions about it. You can practise this skill at home using the questions in reading journals to support your home reading.

This half term we will be completing the 'Playing in an Orchestra' learning

set using Charanga. We will be learning lots of different songs and learn-

Mathematics

This term, we will be focussing on four different units: solving calculation problems, exploring shape, generalising arithmetic and reasoning with measures. We will be:

- Adding and subtracting 1 digit and 2 digit numbers using equipment to help us.
- Learning how to add and subtract using the column method (if you would like to support with this at home, please refer to our Calculation Policy on the school website)
- Naming and describing 2D and 3D shapes, including finding lines of symmetry.
- Making different amounts of money using coins and using subtraction to work out the change.

If you would like to help your child at home, it would be really beneficial if you could continue to practise mental Maths. strategies and times tables (2s, 3s, 5s and 10s). All methods used in class can be found on the website under the 'Year 2 Maths. calculation policy'.

Art and Design Technology

Computing

We will be focussing on creating work, saving and editing on the Seesaw app this half term. We will be focussing on applying these skills across the subjects. We will also be learning about the correct terminology required when using different devices such as: mouse, screen, touchscreen, button and keyboard.

History

We will have a large focus on History this half term as we will be learning all about the Tudor's reign. We will start by learning about Elizabeth I and the impact her reign had on Tudor times. We will also be learning about the famous explorers Francis Drake, who circumnavigated the globe, and Walter Raleigh who introduced potatoes to Ireland.
