

Year 4 Curriculum Letter - Autumn Half Term 2 2022

Our theme for Autumn 2 is:

Rockin' Rainforests

Our main focuses are:

- Finding out what was so rockin' about the rainforest! We will be looking at the different layers, tribes and animals found in the rainforest.
- Locating rainforests such as the Amazon which is the biggest rainforests in the world.
- Exploring the term 'deforestation' and the impact it is having on our planet.
- Looking at current affairs and the impact wild fires has had on the Amazon Rainforest.

P.E.

For P.E. this term, we will be performing dance routines using a range of movement patterns. We will be thinking about different types of dance and how dance can be different depending on location and culture.

Music

This half term we will be learning how to play the Djembe drums, learning how to perform a solo and also as an ensemble.

R.E.

This half-term, we will be looking at Judaism including learning about beliefs and teachings, symbols, worship, codes of conduct and Hannukah.

English

In class this half term, we will be reading 'The Explorer' written by Katherine Rundell. Whilst we are enjoying this book, we will be developing our sentence writing skills and grammar knowledge. We will begin by looking at writing a diary entry from the perspective of another character. We will also be writing setting descriptions based on some of the fantastic places explored by the characters from the book. The book is full of fascinating information about the Amazon Rainforest therefore the children will be writing their own survival guide on how to survive in the deep, dark depths of the jungle. Exciting stuff!

On a weekly basis, your child will have shared reading sessions with the teacher. Where possible, we will use some texts about the rainforest to really consolidate their other learning.



Geography

This topic gives us a fantastic opportunity to think about different countries and environments including the nature around us. We will be locating the world's countries - focusing on South America, looking at key physical and human characteristics and describing and understanding key aspects of vegetation.


Science

The rainforest is home to a vast array of animals and plants, so in Science we will be thinking about how to classify them into different groups. We will also be taking a closer look at the habitat of some of the animals and considering how this can change over time and what impact this has on the animals that live there. For the end of our topic, we will focus on the food chains and webs that create the rainforest 'circle of life'.

Shared home learning

Please encourage your child to read for 15 minutes, as a minimum, every day. This should be logged in their reading journal on a daily basis. Our vocabulary and spellings that we will be practising and looking at over the half term will be shared via See Saw which can be discussed, practised and looked at home. It is always great to ask your child the definitions of the words and see if they can put them into a sentence!

An optional Mathematics, Times Tables and English homework will be set via Seesaw on a weekly basis. A half-term project will be set in the first week which will involve creating something slowly over the entire half-term. This is again optional and will be a project you can decide yourselves how to create.



Mathematics

We will be putting our number knowledge to the test and applying our skills in our calculations and problem solving with addition, subtraction and multiplication. We will be adding, subtracting and multiplying using column methods.

This half term, we will also be exploring Shape and learning about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. We will also be learning about how to reason with measures.

In addition, we will be putting all of our mathematical knowledge into practise during Investigation Week. The children always thoroughly enjoy this week and are eager to get their thinking caps on and get cracking!



Behaviour and Safety

We will be linking our Behaviour and Safety lessons with 'Anti-Bullying Week'. We will be focusing on different bullying scenarios and what we would do.

Personal, Social, Health, and Economy (P.S.H. E)

As part of our No Outsiders scheme, we will be reading 'Dogs don't do ballet' by Anna Kemp and discussing when to be assertive to follow our passions. This will also lead on to a discussion on stereotypes. For our main P.S.H.E. lessons, we will be discussing the laws and human rights.

British Values

We will be looking at 'tolerance of others' and discussing what this means as a class.

Computing

We will be thinking about online safety. This will include online-bullying, managing online information and copyright and ownership. We will also be thinking about online relationships and online reputations.

Art

We will be using overlapping skills to improve mastery of art techniques and creating collages of pictures of animals and the rainforest.

French

This half term's French is En Famille. Year 4 will be learning how to introduce their family members and talk about them.
