Read with fluency a range of age-appropriate texts with enough speed	
for pupils to be able to focus on meaning	
Know the full range of GPC's and use phonic skills consistently to	
address unfamiliar or challenging words	
Read most common exception words effortlessly	
Determine the meaning of new words by sometimes applying knowledge	
of root words and their affixes	
Listen to and discuss a wide range of fiction and non-fiction and begin	
to justify their views or comments	
Fully engage with reading a range of texts, making choices and	
explaining preferences, know some text types	
Identify themes and conventions in a range of books and recognise the	
conventions of a myth or a play script; know how information is	
signposted in reference books	
Recognise how non-fiction books are often organised and presented and	
be able to name their features. Accurately retrieve and record	
information from non-fiction texts	
During discussions ask relevant questions to improve their	
understanding, take turns and build on the thoughts of others	
Explain and discuss their understanding of the text including how a	
character changes through a story or the effect of another	
character's actions	
Check that texts make sense, reading to the punctuation and habitually	
re-reading	
Discuss words and phrases that capture the reader's interest and	
imagination	
Draw inferences and justify with evidence. Draw comparisons	
Predict what might credibly happen from details stated and implied	
Explain the meaning of new words in context; use dictionaries	
accurately to check meaning	
Identify how language, structure and presentation contribute to	
meaning	
Recognise several different forms of poetry and explain their	
differences	

Completing the above statements consistently along with a Benchmark reading level of 27.
