Our theme for Autumn 2 is:





Our main focuses are:

- Learning about the importance of the Mayan Civilisation and the cocoa bean.
- Making comparisons between what it was like during Mayan time and what it is like now.
- Investigating how materials can change state and what the states of matter are.
- Learning the process of The Water Cycle.

Behaviour and Safety

What would the world of children's literature be like without the fabulous Roald Dahl and his amazing books? We will be reading the story 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' (lucky us!) and doing some amazing writing around the story. We will also be watching both of the films; the new version is classed as a PG so please inform your child's class teacher if there are any problems with this.

Children will have the opportunity to explore the weird and wonderful characters of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. We will particularly be focusing on Charlie Bucket and his surroundings. Children will be using their imaginations to write a setting description of Charlie's home. How exciting!

Children will be taking on the role of a reporter and writing a newspaper report on the lucky golden ticket finders! This will involve some drama, for example - role play, interviewing and hot seating.

This half terms French is En Famile. Year 4 will be learning words for family members, relationships, how old they are and what they are called in French.

In addition, we will exploring the world of shape. Children will be identifying and comparing features of 2D and 3D shapes and symmetry.

Willy Wonka runs a successful business; to do this he needs to ensure he keeps close tabs on his money. The children will be helping him with this task by helping him balance his books!

Computing

Year 4 will be exploring the website 'Internet Legends'. Children will be learning about how to stay safe online, choosing a secure password, how to use the safety features of a website and reporting concerns to an adult. They will become e-safety experts in no time!

Art and Design Technology

Children will be mastering the art of sculpture by using a range of materials and resources to create their own version of Willy Wonka's wonderful chocolate factory. They will use techniques which require more accuracy to cut, shape, join and create their work.

This half-term, we will be looking at Judaism including learning about beliefs and teachings, symbols, worship, codes of conduct and Hannukah.

P.E.

In P.E., children will be focusing on creating characters and narrative through movement and gesture. They will gain inspiration from literacy characters from our book 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'.

This topic is based on a song called The Maya (Sing Up). The pupils will learn about Latin American Music, song structure, call and response, and syncopation. The pupils will add movement and a clave rhythm to the song and they will perform it at the end of the topic.
