Home Learning: Week 9

Monday

Phonics / Writing Activity:

<u>Today's focus sound: ur</u> (Please look at the Phonics sheets in the resources section.)

Maths Activity:

Collect lots of sticks on your daily walk. Can you put them in order by size? Which is the longest? Which is the shortest?

Creative Activity:

Hide treasure in your garden and make a treasure map to mark the spot of where it is hidden.

Physical Activity:

Try throwing and catching a soft object on the spot. Between throwing the object and catching it you should clap your hands. You must clap quickly to make sure you don't drop the object! For an extra challenge add another action e.g touch your toes.

Extra Activities:

Create some clues to go with your treasure map.

Ask the members of your family to use your clues and map to find the treasure that you have hidden.

Tuesday

Phonics / Writing Activity: <u>Today's focus sound: ow</u>

(Please look at the Phonics sheets in the resources section.)

Maths Activity:

What numbers can you form with the sticks that you collected yesterday?

Creative Activity:

Have a go at making your own bird feeder for the birds that you explore in the extra activities.

Physical Activity:

Run around and listen to the instructions from your grown-up. When you hear them shout 'up', jump up high. When you hear them shout 'down', bend down and try to touch the floor.

Extra Activities:

Learn about different types of British Birds using the internet.

Go Bird spotting on your walk and see if you can spot any of the birds you have learnt about. Can name any of the birds? How do you know which bird it is?

Wednesday

Phonics / Writing Activity:

<u>Today's focus sound: oi</u> (Please look at the Phonics sheets in the resources section.)

Maths Activity:

With 10 sticks, explore how many different ways you can make 10. (e.g. 1+9=10)

Creative Activity:

Make perfume using petals found in your garden or on your walk. What does it smell like?

Physical Activity:

Using chalk on the floor or an old sheet, write a range of numbers in a random order. When the grown-up shouts out a number, try to jump to the correct number.

Extra Activities:

Make ramps for cars with different materials. Investigate which material allows the car to go faster and which material slows the car down.

Sort objects in your house by their colour. How many red things can you find? Can you find more blue or more yellow objects?

Thursday

Phonics/ Writing Activity: <u>Today's focus sound: ear</u> (Please look at the Phonics

Please look at the Phonics sheets in the resources section.)

Maths Activity:

Choose an amount of sticks.
Can you share the sticks equally between you and 1 other person? Do you have the same amount? Explore with different amounts of sticks.

Creative Activity:

Can you create a symmetrical butterfly? How can you make sure it is the same on both sides?

Physical Activity:

Using household or garden objects such as pillows and cushions, tables and chair or old boxes, create a crawling obstacle course. Ask someone to time you to see how long it takes for you to crawl around the course.

Extra Activities:

Mix cornflour with water and explore the texture. What words can you use to describe the texture?

Make a 'chain reaction' with dominoes or books.

Friday

Phonics / Writing Activity:
Read or watch the story

'stickman' on YouTube.

Can you write some sentences about what happens in the story?

Maths Activity:

If I had 2 sticks and I doubled the amount of sticks. How many sticks would I have altogether? Explore doubling different amounts with the sticks.

Creative Activity:

Can you create a stickman using the sticks that you have used for maths this week? Can you create anything else with the sticks. Email us pictures of your wonderful creations.

Physical Activity:

Try to balance a balloon on different body parts e.g. your head, hand, foot, shoulder, arm. How many seconds can you keep the balloon balanced for?

Extra Activities:

Watch a film. Who is your favourite character? Why? How did the film make you feel? What was the best part?

Play a card game like snap with your family. Make sure you use your turn taking skills!
