Creative Curriculum

Pupils follow a rich and comprehensive curriculum. We provide pupils with a thorough coverage of the National Curriculum in a way that engages pupils through a topic-based curriculum. Each topic is centred on what pupils are interested in and what they want to learn about. This child-initiated approach ensures that pupils have a firm grasp of subjects and also a passion for life-long learning. Have a look on our website at some of the topic titles we are covering at the moment.

Links between topics are made with engaging lessons and, where appropriate, hands-on experience. Visits and visitors are used to enhance learning experiences. Pupils also have the opportunity to have focus days or weeks in school where one subject, such as French, becomes the one that is taught for the whole day. We have had Mathematics Investigation days, Healthy Living, French, History, Orienteering, Art Weeks and Design Technology weeks.

Alongside the National Curriculum, pupils also develop skills on how to become a better learner – these are called Ingredients For Success (IFS). These cover the skills we feel will enable our pupils to be successful throughout their lives. These cover: perseverance, articulation, team work, creativity and resilience to name a few. 'IFS' are very important to us as we want to ensure we are helping pupils to become well-rounded lifelong learners.

All children are encouraged to develop their skills, self-confidence, relationships, strengths and learning from their very first day at school. Across the Foundation Stage we aim to give our children the best possible start to school life. We have exciting topics that the children become really engaged in. There are daily phonics sessions that the children love, and a safe, engaging and fun environment for children to explore and learn both inside and outside.

Children are encouraged to access these environments through adult led and child initiated activities that enable them to test their ideas, make links, and explore the environment around them. Children are also encouraged to question and to explore how things work. This helps children to develop their critical thinking and

questioning skills which encourages them to be an active learner and to leave the Foundation Stage ready for KS1.

During Mathematics lessons pupils are grouped by ability to ensure that work is suited to the needs of all learners.




