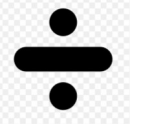


# Maths - Week 13 Day 3

Can you remember what we looked at yesterday in maths?  
That's right! Division! Can you remember the division sign?



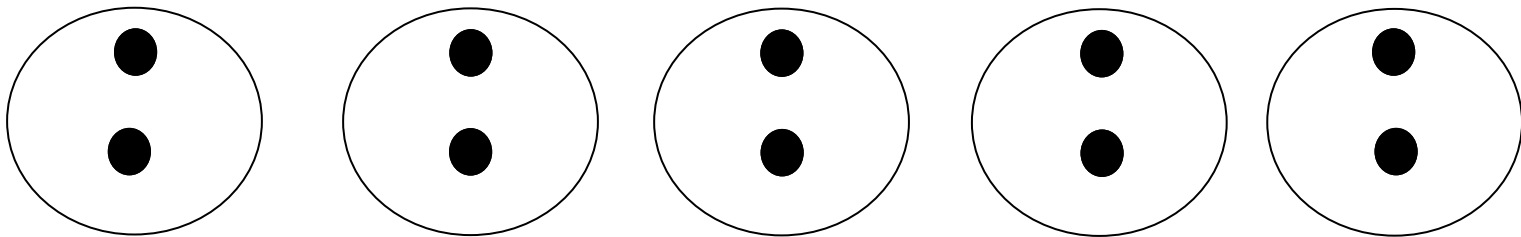
Today we're going to focus on word problems again but drawing pictures to help us, instead of using physical objects.

Let's have a go at one together. Read the word problem below and pick out the main parts, e.g. the numbers.

I have 10 books and I share them between my 5 friends. How many books will they each have?

To solve this it's asking us to do 10 divided by 5.

So we need to draw 10 dots into 5 circles. Remember they need to be equal, so we're going to put one dot in each circle one at a time.



Now we've shared the 10 dots into 5 circles, equally, we want to know how many one circle has got.

How many does one circle have? 2!

So 10 divided by 5 = 2.

Now we've practised a word problem together, can you have a go on your own or with an adult?

Remember- look at how many you're sharing by and draw that many circles. Then share the dots equally.

Look out for how many you're sharing by, some are sharing by 2, 5 or 10!

1. I have 2 chocolate bars and I want to share them between by 2 friends. How many will they each have?
2. I share 10 grapes between my 5 friends. How many will they each have?
3. I have 30 flowers and I share them between 10 of my friends. How many flowers will they each have?
4. My sister has 22 dolls and she shares them between 2 of her friends. How many dolls will they each have?
5. My friend has 15 pieces of crisps and he shares them between 5 friends. How many crisps will they each have?
6. I have 40 sweets and I share them between 10 friends. How many will they each have?
