Art Week 5

L.O: To use a range of pencil techniques to sketch a picture.

This PowerPoint takes you through different pencil techniques and sketching different things using these pencil techniques. Don't worry about getting it all done in one day, it could take 3-4 days. Enjoy drawing and becoming your very own artist!

This week you are going to become artists!

Do you know what an artist is?

What do they do? Can you name any artists?

Artist

An artist is a person who creates art. This could be drawing, painting or many other things.










This week you are going to use pencil techniques to sketch different things...

Do you recognise any of these pencil techniques?



First we will look at colouring lightly.



This technique shows using a colouring pencil/crayon. All you need to do is hold the pencil and colour in as you usually would, however you only need to press the pencil down very gently on the paper. This can be used for shading lightly.

Can you get a colouring pencil and have a go at colouring lightly? Remember, don't press down too hard!

Next we will look at colouring darkly.



What is different about this technique and the last one we looked at?

This technique is similar to colouring lightly, the only difference is you now need to press down hard on the paper. This makes sure the colour is dark and bold.

Can you get a colouring pencil and have a go at colouring darkly? Remember, you need to press down hard on the paper!

Now let's look at a technique called gradate.



This technique shows using a colouring pencil/crayon. You begin colouring darkly by pressing down hard and end up pressing gently so you are now colouring lightly.

This shows a gradate effect.

Can you get a colouring pencil and have a go at the gradate technique?

Next let's look at a technique called hatching.



This technique shows using a colouring pencil/crayon. All you need to do is draw lines in the same direction to create a hatch effect.

Can you get a colouring pencil and have a go at the hatching technique?


Next let's look at a technique called cross-hatching.



This technique shows using a colouring pencil/crayon. You begin by doing the hatch technique (drawing lines in the same direction). You then have to draw lines in the opposite direction to create a cross-hatch effect.

Can you get a colouring pencil and have a go at the cross-hatching technique?

The last technique is called layering.




This technique shows using different coloured pencils. You then use the different colours next to each other to create a layered effect.

Can you get a colouring pencil and have a go at the layering technique?


