## TASK 1- reading and comprehension




## Task 2

To start, our book reviews needs a title page. So for this task I would like you to draw the front cover of the book, including the title and author. ## Task 3

So, for this task I want you to list all the good points about this book. What did you most like about the book? Is it the pictures? Characters? Story line? Language? Is there a certain part or chapter that is better than the rest? Have a think and gather all the good points you have about this book.

I would now like you to list the not so good points about the book. Are there any parts of this book you don't particularly like? Remember a book review needs to be honest so no right or wrong answers here! Maybe you didn't like one of the characters or was the language used too hard? Was there a chapter that was quite dull? You could even think about what the author could've done to make this book even better!

## Task 4

So far you should have drawn the front cover of the book and have some good points about the book and some not so good points. They will be needed to write our honest book review.

For this task we are going to split our writing into three parts (or paragraphs). For the first part, I'd like you to start with 'I'd recommend this book because...' You can then write some sentences for why you would want someone to read this book, what are the good points?

For the second part or paragraph, you could start with 'However...' Here you can then list the not so good qualities of the book or improvements you think could be made.

For the final part what is your overall opinion? Would you want your friend at school to read it? Give the book a star review out of 5 at the bottom of your page. Is it 1 star=terrible or is it 5 star= Outstanding? Or is it somewhere in the middle (2,3 or 4 stars)?
