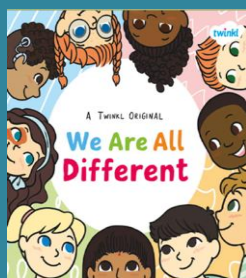


BOOK OF THE WEEK
